



STROUD CEMETERY

PURCHASE OF EXCLUSIVE RIGHT OF BURIAL

I refer to the attached application for Exclusive Right of Burial in Grave No in the Stroud Cemetery.

In making that Application, I am aware that the Grave is situated in a **Lawn section** of the Cemetery. I understand that, following interment(s) within the Grave, the intention is to incorporate the Grave within the lawned area.

I understand that over a period of time at the discretion of the Burial Authority, the Grave will be levelled and turfed for ease of future maintenance.

I understand that the Purchase of the Exclusive Right of Burial **does not grant any rights to erect any memorial, headstone or kerbing** on the Grave.

I understand that application for any such memorial must be **made separately** to the Burial Authority along with approval of any inscription or other marking intended to be placed thereon or subsequently.

- The Burial Authority reserves the right to grant or refuse any such permission at its discretion, but that normally such permission will be granted in accordance with the prevailing policies in these matters.
- Depending on where the grave is located in the cemetery, permission to erect a memorial may not be granted for up to **1 year** from the date of burial.
- Whilst permission will not be formally granted, the Burial Authority will not normally object to the marking of a Grave by a simple wooden cross in the period pending the erection of a permanent memorial. The Burial Authority reserves the right to remove any such grave marker.
- Permission may be granted for an area of 1 metre, measured from the back of the headstone (or in the case of a cremated remains plot 600mm from the back of the plot), to be used for personal tributes such as a vase or garden planting. The area should be no wider than 600mm.
