License application

Amber Taverns Ltd - 2 King Street (Formerly M&Co). Reference: 24/00610/LAPRNW

The applicant has already volunteered several conditions in agreement with the police. These conditions will be included on the licence. These conditions are about CCTV, door staff etc but also include the following which may address some of the concerns that the Town Council have

Signage

Suitable, clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed at all exits requesting customers leaving the premises do so quietly and considerately.

Frontage

No drinks (except off sales) will be allowed to be taken outside the front of the building by customers. This will be reinforced when SIA Door Supervisors are employed. Appropriate signage will be on display at the exit.

Pub Watch

The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) shall join the Stroud Safe scheme and actively participate in this scheme whilst it exists. The DPS, or nominated member of staff in their absence, shall attend any Stroud Safe meetings held.

I note that the Town Council are requesting that noise limitation must be employed, and a vestibule should be in place to protect against noise. If you would like me too I can contact the applicant to see if they would volunteer agreement to this as a condition or if not how they propose to prevent noise nuisance to the neighbouring flats. However, if they do not agree voluntarily, it could only be considered if the Town Council are making formal representation. If this is a formal representation it will instigate the hearing process and a hearing panel would then decide if it is appropriate to impose it as a condition of the licence. Please can you clarify whether this is a formal representation from the Town Council.

Also please can you confirm whether the Town Council are making formal representation against the opening times or this just an observation. If the Town Council is formally making representation about the opening hours please could you give some more detail for the reasons which can provided for the applicant and hearing panel.

Remember that there is also the review process. If the licence is granted as requested and there are subsequent problems, a request can be made for a review by a hearing panel.

PLANNING ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATION: CLOSURE REPORT

Site Carlton House, London Road, Stroud Summary Erection Of Signage Reference EN24/0158

Thank you for your planning enforcement referral, referenced above.

Having reviewed your referral and investigated this matter, I am writing to inform you that we have now closed the case.

Our reasons for closing this case are:

The Carlton Club is a private members club situated within Carlton House, London Road, Stroud. New China Stroud Takeaway is a separate business that operates from the Carlton Club. It provides both takeaways and home deliveries for the local area. It also caters for functions within the Club.

Carlton House is not a listed building but it is within the Stroud Town Centre Conservation Area. The issue raised was the erection of a larger banner without advertisement consent.

The complaint was investigated and it was found that there were 2 large banners erected. One was for the Carlton Club and the other for the New China Stroud Takeaway neither of which had deemed consent under Schedule 3 of The Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 2007.

Both signs have been removed.

There is no longer a breach of planning regulations.

Upon investigation it was found that no planning permission had been sought when the New China Stroud Takeaway business was started within the Carlton Club. As the Carlton Club is primarily a drinking establishment a change of use would be required to run the takeaway from this location.

No complaints have been raised regarding the operation of the takeaway. The takeaway business may cause a small increase in the volume of people using the Club, but as it mainly provides deliveries and the club is only open to members (and not the general public) it is considered that this causes little or no harm to the area.

As this is the case it is not expedient, or in the public interest to take any further enforcement action at this time. The case will be closed accordingly.

Consequently the council has decided it is inexpedient to take planning enforcement action We have closed the case and will take no action.

The Stroud District Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 198 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 make the following Order-

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as TPO Number TPO/0602 Liss Coed, Stratford Road, Stroud, Gloucestershire, 2024.

Interpretation

- 2. (1) In this Order "the authority" means Stroud District Council.
- (2) In this Order any reference to a numbered section is a reference to the section so numbered in the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and any reference to a numbered regulation is a reference to the regulation so numbered in the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation) (England) Regulations 2012.

Effect

- 3. (1) Subject to article 4, this Order takes effect provisionally on the date on which it is made.
- (2) Without prejudice to subsection (7) of section 198 (power to make tree preservation orders) or subsection (1) of section 200 (tree preservation orders: Forestry Commissioners) and, subject to the exceptions in regulation 14, no person shall-
 - (a) cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage, or wilfully destroy; or
 - (b) cause or permit the cutting down, topping, lopping, wilful damage or wilful destruction of.

any tree specified in the Schedule to this Order except with the written consent of the authority in accordance with regulations 16 and 17, or of the Secretary of State in accordance with regulation 23, and, where such consent is given subject to conditions, in accordance with those conditions.



Application to trees to be planted pursuant to a condition

4. In relation to any tree identified in the first column of the Schedule by the letter "C", being a tree to be planted pursuant to a condition imposed under paragraph (a) of section 197 (planning permission to include appropriate provision for preservation and planting of trees), this Order takes effect as from the time when the tree is planted.



Bisley Old Road near Stroud - Proposed EV Chargepoint Location

The next phase of the EV Chargepoint (EVCP) rollout supported by LEVI funding has started.

The rollout is in support of the county's ULEV strategy to give residents that do not have a driveway the ability to charge an EV close to their home. This will remove a barrier that is stopping many residents from purchasing an EV.

This location in Bisley Old Road near Stroud is proposed.

Can you please review the proposed location.

In this location we propose a phased approach to mitigate the concerns of some residents who contacted us in other locations where the loss of parking was raised as an issue. This will address the shortage of EV charging now yet still allow for expansion in future as EV use increases. Initially the council will mark out and sign two bays, leaving two bays unmarked. The marked bays will be enforced to ensure that they are only used by EV drivers. The others will be courtesy bays where non-EV drivers can park, but we would ask that they keep these clear if other bays are available. We will monitor demand for EV charging and mark out the 3rd and 4th bays later as demand picks up.

Can you please give me feedback on the proposed location by reply to this email as soon as you are able and by 25th July.

We will shortly be doing a letter drop to local residents to gather their views.

Street naming

Q: I am enquiring if roads can still be named after prominent stroud locals and, if so, how one would go about putting together an application for this. I am referring to my late father, Dr John Mould, Stroud GP until his retirement, when he then served two terms as a Stroud District Councillor.

We would be thinking about Stroud first since he was born in Stroud in Rowcroft House (now Rowcroft Medical Centre) in 1928 and went on to become a Stroud GP (following in his father's footsteps, Dr Herman Mould), who he went in to practice with. They opened Beeches Green Health Centre in the 1970/80s, where his picture is still hanging on the wall. He retired aged 65 and went on to win two terms as a local Lib Dem Councillor (?1986). I would have to check my dates. As a Councillor he was one of those who were instrumental in setting up Care and Repair in the Stroud District. He was a lifelong "Stroudie"! He was so passionate about Stroud and surrounding area. This is just a very brief outline to give an idea.

SDC response: Yes, roads can be named after prominent Stroud locals. Depending upon where the road requiring naming is located, the naming proposal would require the approval of Stroud District Council and the appropriate Town or Parish Council.

If you would like a name to be considered for future use, is there a particular location of preference? So for example if it were in Stroud (and suitable) I would advise the Town Council to consider the proposal for any future street naming requirement.

Request to STC from SDC: Please could the name of Dr John Mould be considered for any future street naming requirements in Stroud. There is nothing immediately imminent but please could you retain this for reference.



Consultation on Stroud District Council's Statement of Principles under the Gambling Act 2005

Stroud District Council's current Statement of Principles under the Gambling Act 2005 will expire in January 2025. The Statement sets out the principles the Council will apply when carrying out its functions under the Gambling Act 2005 and it must be reviewed and republished at least every three years.

There are only a small number of Gambling Premises in Stroud District which include 4 betting shops and 2 adult gaming centres (at Michaelwood services). Under the Gambling Act we also issue permits for gaming machines in pubs and social clubs and issue registrations for small society lotteries.

The Council is seeking views on its Statement of Principles for January 2025 to January 2028. The proposal is to make no changes to the statement from the current Statement of Principles. You can see the draft Statement of Principles and how to make comments on our consultation webpage
