New look gallery launched

Community venue Lansdown Hall has officially launched its revamped gallery.

The around floor gallery has been completely revamped in a £75,000 project. It is the second phase

of major work since Stroud Town Council bought the hall and saved it from closure.

The payment for this phase of the improvements was provided by a £45,000 contribution from the town council and a £30,000 grant from the Gloucestershire Environmental Trust with donations from the Cory Landfill

Trust.

The improvements included reopening the hall's original entrance from Lansdown which had been blocked off for almost 100 years, with the addition of a ramp to provide accessibility for all directly from the street. The gallery space has been

News in brief Community groups backed

Stroug

Stroud Town Council has awarded £7,056 in grants to community groups.

Three organisations received Community Support Fund grants. They included: Age Concern, the Acorn Day Centre (£3,000), Stroud Christian Fellowship for debt counselling (£1,250) and Gloucestershire Printmaking Co-operative (£1,000).

Small grants were awarded to: Friends of Daisy Bank (£384), Stroud Valley School PTFA (£500), Centre for the Spoken Word (£455), Stroud Preservation Trust (£467).

Clearing paths

Work is being carried out to improve Stroud footpaths.

Many paths blocked with overgrowth and debris have been cleared, waymarks and signposts have been replaced and stiles repaired.

The work is being carried out by the town council, the county council and the **Stroud Community** Land Trust.

Council opposes burner plan

Stroud Town Council is calling for the Government to have the final say on the proposed massive incinerator at Javelin Park.

The application, the town council says, should not be decided by Gloucestershire County Council.

Town councillors have written to Eric Pickles, the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, to call in the application.

The county has already agreed to award a contract to Ubaser Balfour Beatty to build the incinerator in Haresfield. If the scheme does not go ahead the county will have to pay a £15 million penalty to the company. In its letter to the Government the council said it was "concerned about the democratic process being subverted by the £15

million penalty clause".

The letter states there are grave concerns about the possible effect on people's health as a result of the emissions.

Councillors object to the incinerator being built in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, calling it "hugely intrusive".

The town council states that there is insufficient waste to justify an incinerator and will be less in future with the increased use of recycling in the locality.

The town council is urging members of the public to write to the Government, asking for the proposal to be called in. Further details available on www.glosvain.info

The county is likely to consider the planning application in February.
