<p>Description Seven bayed, two storey building in brick with some stone details. All original windows with pleasing details. Four brick arches frame windows and doors at ground floor. A building whose details give it a pleasant Edwardian elegance. Lofty interior with some original details including floor boards and tiles.</p> <p>Originally built in 18th century, re-fronted late 19th/early 20th century. Formerly The Lamb Inn, with Royal mail coaches to London and back daily. Still a public house.</p> <p>Sources Fisher, P.H.(1871), Notes and Recollections of Stroud, London and Stroud, Trübner and Co, J Elliott (p.66,180)</p>	
Selection Criteria	
Age	Site has been used for a public house since at least the 18th century.
Architectural and aesthetic value	Attractive building with an elegance unusual for a brick pub.
Historic association	On site of old coaching inn, The Lamb
Social and communal value	A rare and popular survival of a town centre pub serving its intended function.
Degree of completeness	The Edwardian exterior is little altered.
Date of inclusion	June 2017
