Description

A single-storey building constructed in the early 20th century, featuring a stone arch entrance and a glazed frontage with highly decorative coloured leaded lights. The leaded lights have been boarded over – maybe damaged during refurbishments? One of a pair of matching shop fronts (with No.3 next door).

There is a photo in *Stroud Streets and Shops* of the building in a previous incarnation as G. Jurisch, 'ladies' and gents' haircutting rooms', that reveals the decorative leaded lights.

Selection Criteria	
Age	A late Victorian/early 20th-century building
Rarity	Unusual, with a mix of materials and a striking frontage. No similar frontages in Stroud.
Architectural and aesthetic value	Shows the influence of Art Nouveau in the design of the windows.
Group value	One of a matching pair of shop fronts.
Degree of completeness	Outside complete, though leaded lights boarded up; interior much altered.
Date of inclusion	June 2017
