Description

A single-storey building constructed between 1889 and 1920, comprising a stone arched entrance and a glazed frontage with highly decorative coloured leaded lights. Part of a pair of matching shop fronts (with No.1, next door). Stone pilasters at the entrance. The interior is small and irregularly shaped.

Selection Criteria	
Age	A late Victorian/early 20th-century building
Rarity	Unusual, with a mix of materials and a striking glazed frontage. No similar frontages in Stroud.
Architectural and aesthetic value	Shows the influence of Art Nouveau in the design of the windows.
Group value	One of a matching pair of shop fronts.
Degree of completeness	Outside complete; interior much altered.
Date of inclusion	June 2017
